The objective of the project is to provide the analytical basis for the need, the feasibility and the scope of a socio-ecological transition, to derive policy instruments for shifting Europe to a new "high road path", and the institutional changes needed at all policy levels. The work package I am responsible for focuses on industrial policy. The project involves 18 partners across the EU27 in Austria, Hungary, France, Germany, Italy, Slovakia, Hungary, Belgium, Czech Republic, Sweden, and Spain. Co-investigator (Lead at Birmingham). Sum awarded €164,000.

April 2012 – June 2016 AHRC - Communities, Cultures and Creative Economies Cultural intermediation: connecting communities in the creative urban economy

The project looks at the value of cultural intermediation and how this activity can be enhanced to create more effective connections between communities and the creative economy. The objectives of the research are: to create new ways of measuring value; to analyse the historic development of cultural intermediation to inform current practice; to examine how intermediation fits within the existing policy landscape and the governance of relations between the different actors; and to explore the effectiveness of intermediation activity from a community perspective. The project involves five partners across the UK. Co-investigator. Sum awarded: £25,000.



December 2012-November 2015 FP7 Regions of Knowledge 2012 SmartCulture – Scientific Coordinator

The SmartCulture project aims to provide sustainable access to cultural heritage to a wider range of users by the use of digital technologies. Digital technologies will help to transform passive audiences into active practitioners of culture. The consortium will promote the creation of engaging digital experiences for access to cultural resources by the cross-fertilization between ICT enterprises, Creative and Cultural Industries (especially SMEs) and research stakeholders across Europe. This cross fertilization will lead to new opportunities and good practices for innovative digital access to cultural resources and digital cultural mediation. These challenges fully comply with the objectives of the Work Program for ICT of the FP7 and the EU Work Plan for Culture 2011-2014 and with the conclusions of the green paper on Cultural and Creative Industries. The project involves 13 partners across EU27 in Bulgaria, Netherlands, Spain, Denmark, France and Italy. Co-investigator (Lead at Birmingham). Sum awarded € 363,274,36.

RESEARCH IMPACT

BIBLIOMETRIC DATA

My research impact is evidenced by my bibliometric data. I am confident that an h-index of 23 (April 2017) (Harzig metric) is evidence of the interest that my publications have generated and their impact on shaping the academic debate.

My top ten most cited publications consistently using the Harzig's metric are listed below. My most influential intellectual contributions are not necessarily in the highest ABS ranked journals, for two reasons: one is that there is inevitably a lag in the citation process and secondly that open access publications (such as books and online open access reports) are more quickly read and therefore cited in published work. Indeed my most cited publication is the Handbook of Industrial Districts I coedited and that was published in 2009

Some of my publications have had a great impact in the policy debate. For instance, my work on EU regional policy published in the Journal of European Public Policy 2002 and in the Journal of Common Market Studies 2004 have been referred to in very prestigious publications The JEEP 2002 paper was cited in the Barca Report [EU Commission, 2009, An agenda for a reformed cohesion policy, Brussels] and the EU Commission report on 'EU research on Social Sciences and Humanities'; while the JCMS 2004 was cited in the EU Research report authored by Charles Sabel and Jonathan Zeitlin, a World Bank Policy Research Working Paper [Shankar, R. and Shah, A. 2009. Lessons from EU Policies for Regional Development, World Bank] and an OEDC Working Paper on Public Governance.

My policy impact is also evidenced by the interest that policy makers have expressed towards my work: I have been an invited participant in high profile events organised by the European Committee of the Regions, and the European Commission on themes such as EU competitiveness, clusters and creative industries.

My commitment to income generation is evidenced by my participation in project grant applications



on different fronts; this has resulted in a constant stream of project grant awards. This can be taken as evidence of my ability to leverage the international scholarly networks I have developed over time.
